



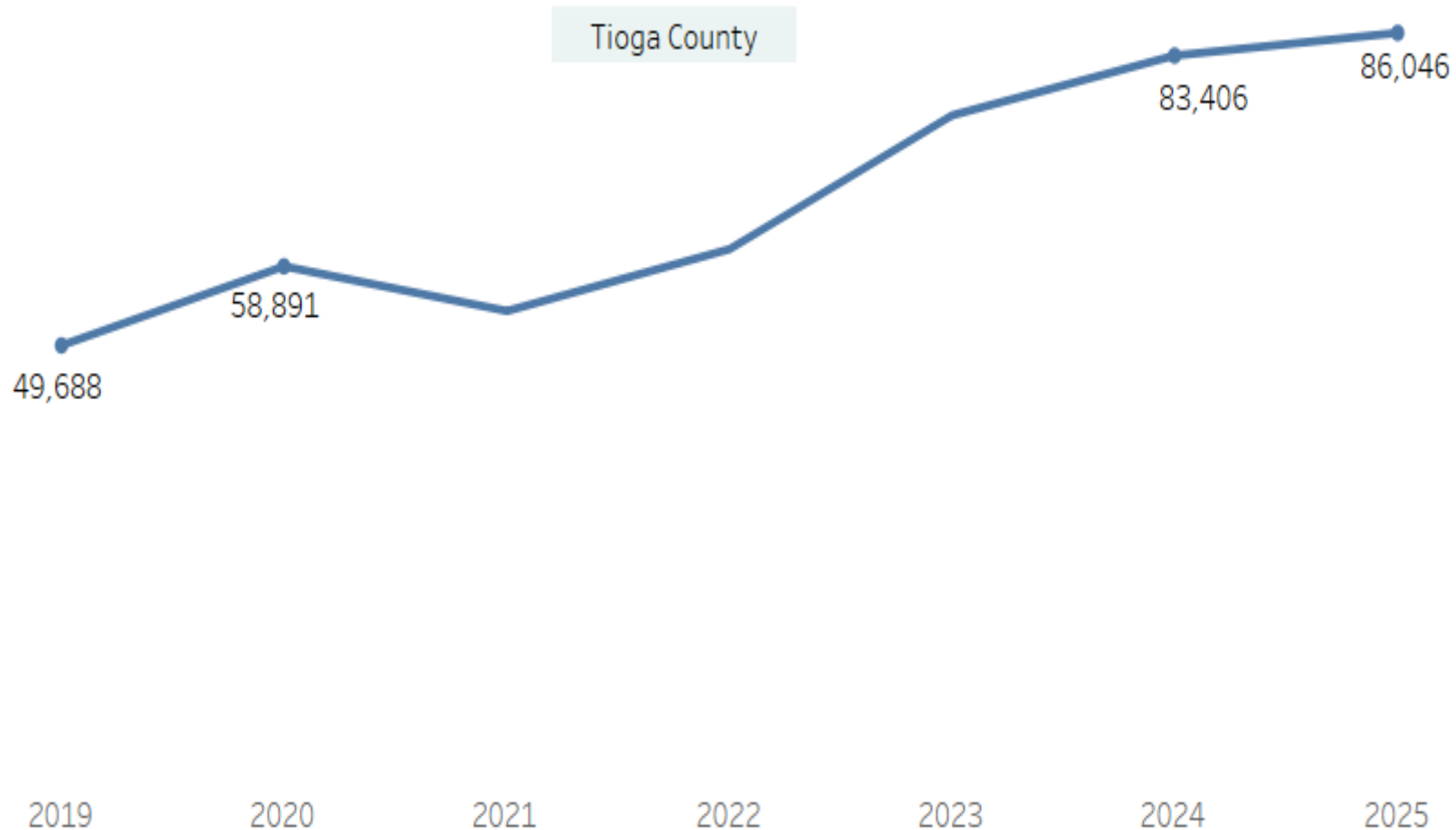

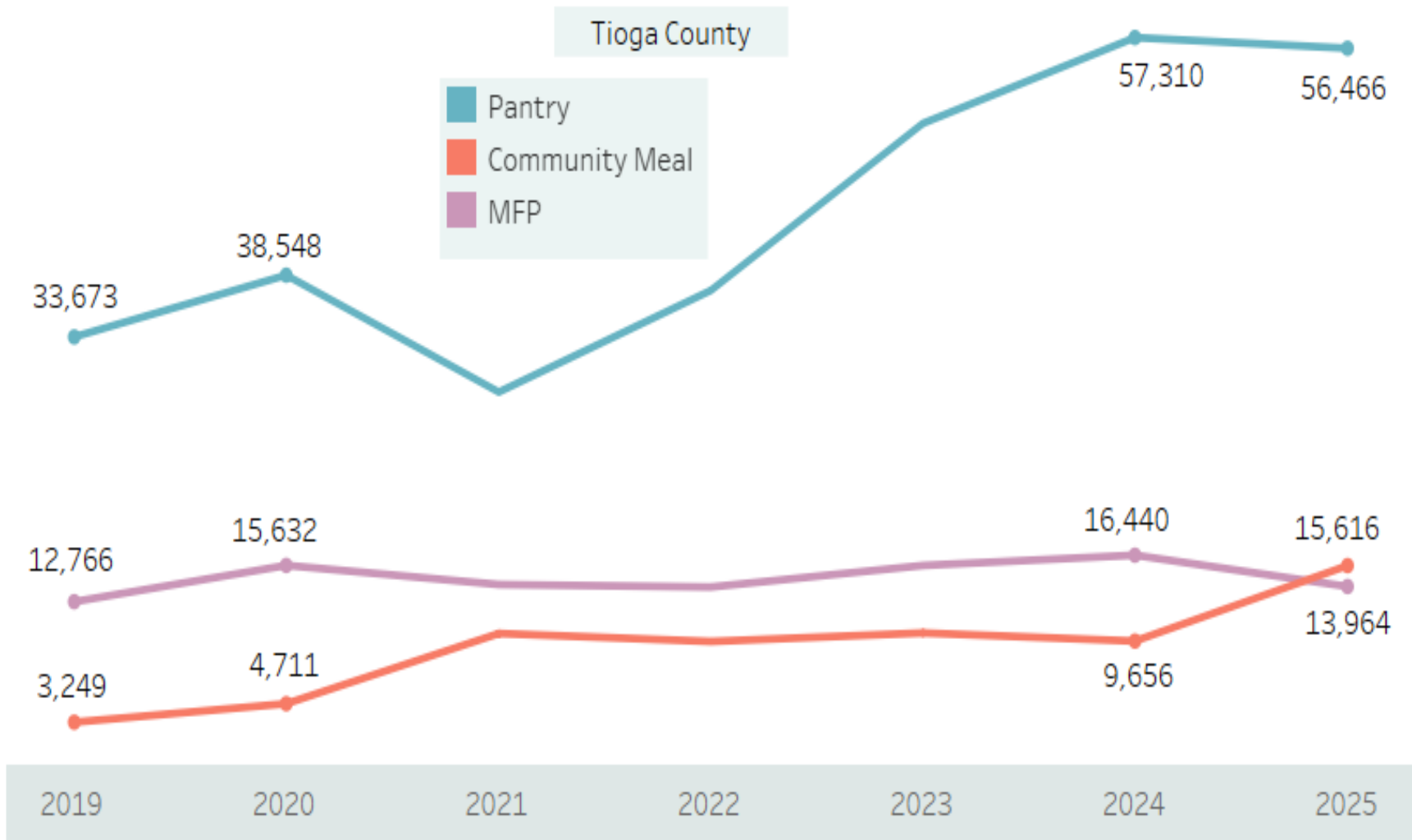
## Annual Individual Requests for Food Pantries, MFPs, and Community Meal Sites



This graph shows service numbers for our “Big Three” programs— non-senior Mobile Food Pantries (MFPs), community meal sites, and food pantries in Tioga County. These are the programs/ agencies that are open to the public and that we use as our best proxy for demand.

The number of individual requests for food across these three programs in Tioga County is **↑ 3%** compared to 2024, **↑ 46%** compared to 2020 (5 years ago), and **↑ 73%** compared to 2019 (pre-COVID).

# Annual Individual Requests for Food Pantries, MFPs, and Community Meal Sites



This graph shows service numbers for each of our “Big Three” programs.

Pantries only (Tioga) –

- ▼ **1%** compared to 2024
- ↑ **46%** compared to 2020 (5 years ago)
- ↑ **67%** compared to 2019 (pre-COVID)

MFPs only (Tioga) –

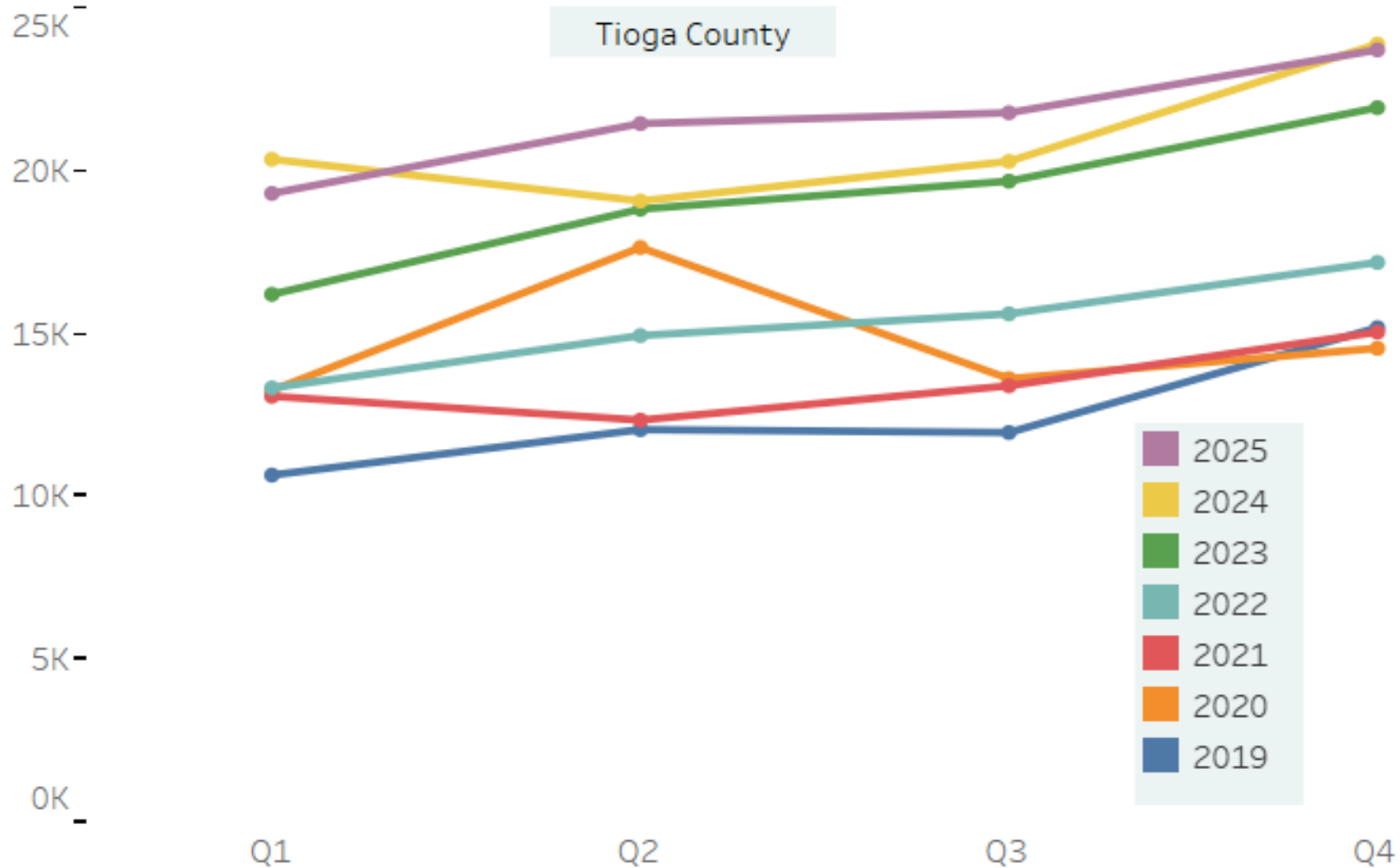
- ▼ **15%** compared to 2024
- ↑ **11%** compared to 2020 (5 years ago)
- ↑ **9%** compared to 2019 (pre-COVID)

Community Meal Sites only (Tioga) –

- ↑ **62%** compared to 2024
- ↑ **231%** compared to 2020 (5 years ago)
- ↑ **381%** compared to 2019 (pre-COVID)

# Individual Requests for Food Across Quarters

## Pantries, MFPs, and Community Meal Sites



This graph also shows individual requests for food across the three programs on the previous graph, comparing quarters across the years for the sum of those three programs in Tioga County.

**2025 remained even with or above 2024 for each quarter - at all-time high levels.**
