



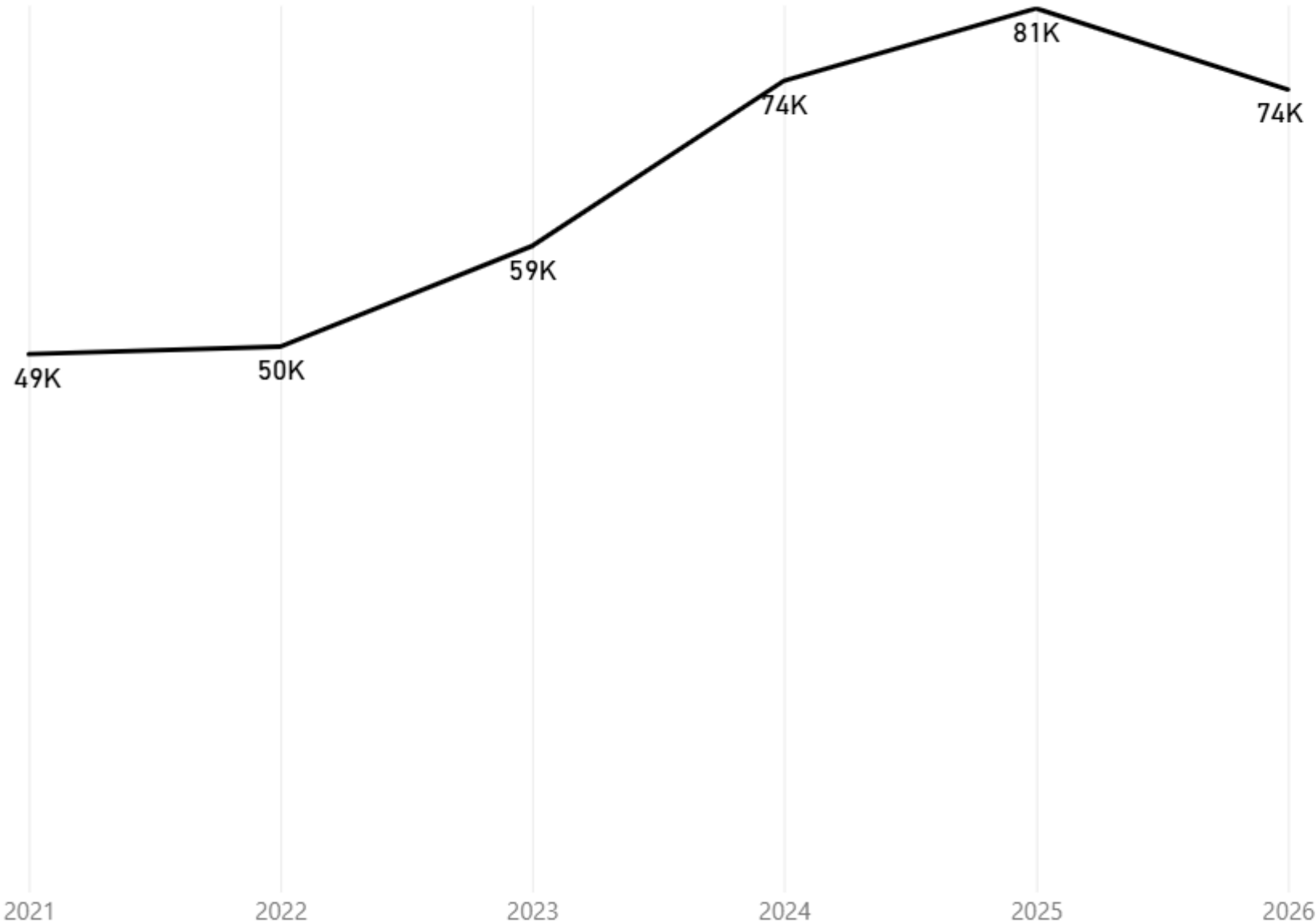

Q1 Meal Site & Pantry & Regular MFP



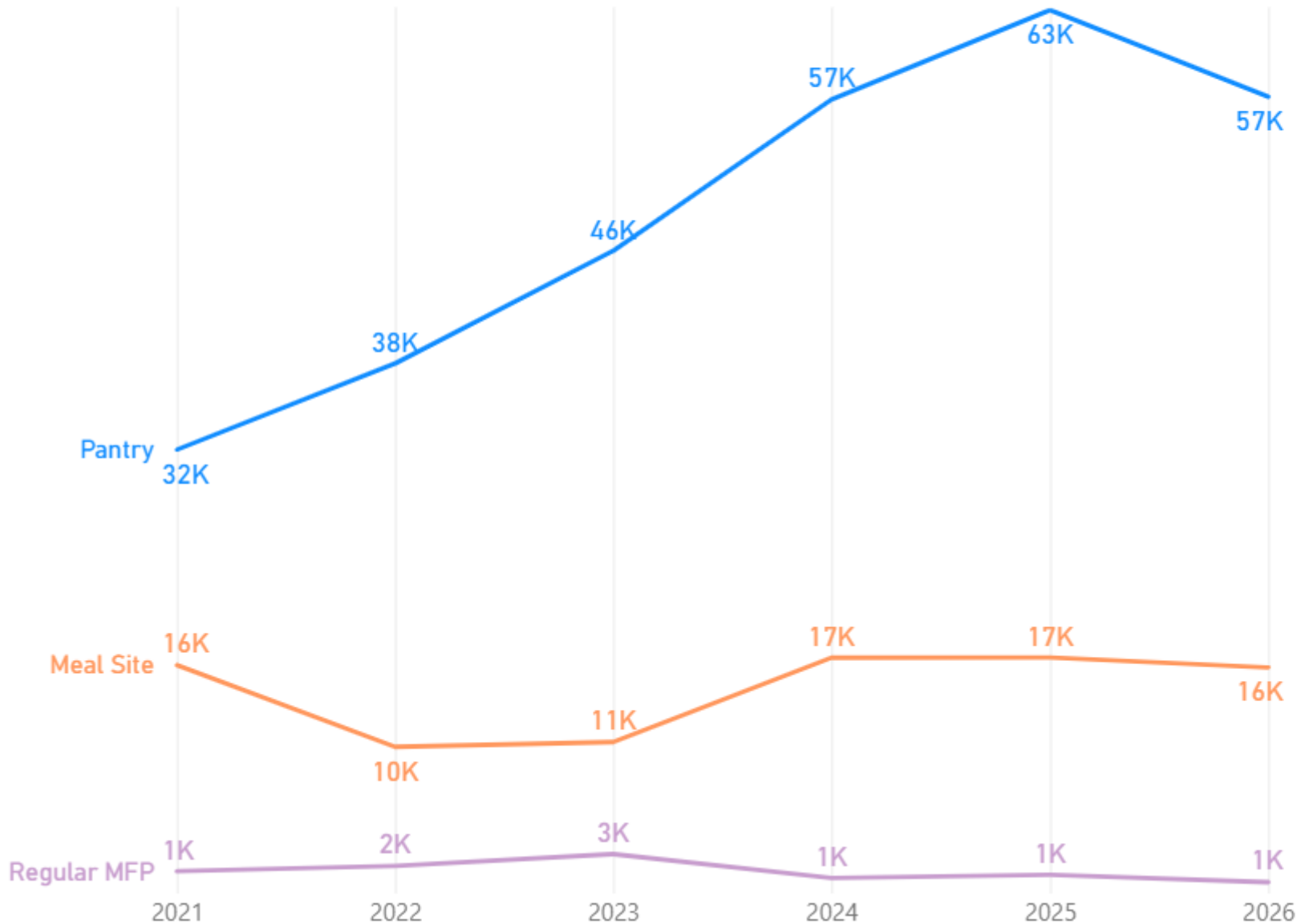
This graph shows service numbers for our “Big Three” programs– non-senior Mobile Food Pantries (MFPs), community meal sites, and food pantries. These are the programs/ agencies that are open to the public and we use as our best proxy for demand.

The number of individual requests for food across these three programs is:

- ▼ 9% compared to 2025
- ▲ 49% compared to 2021

- ↑ 80% compared to 2021

Meal Sites:

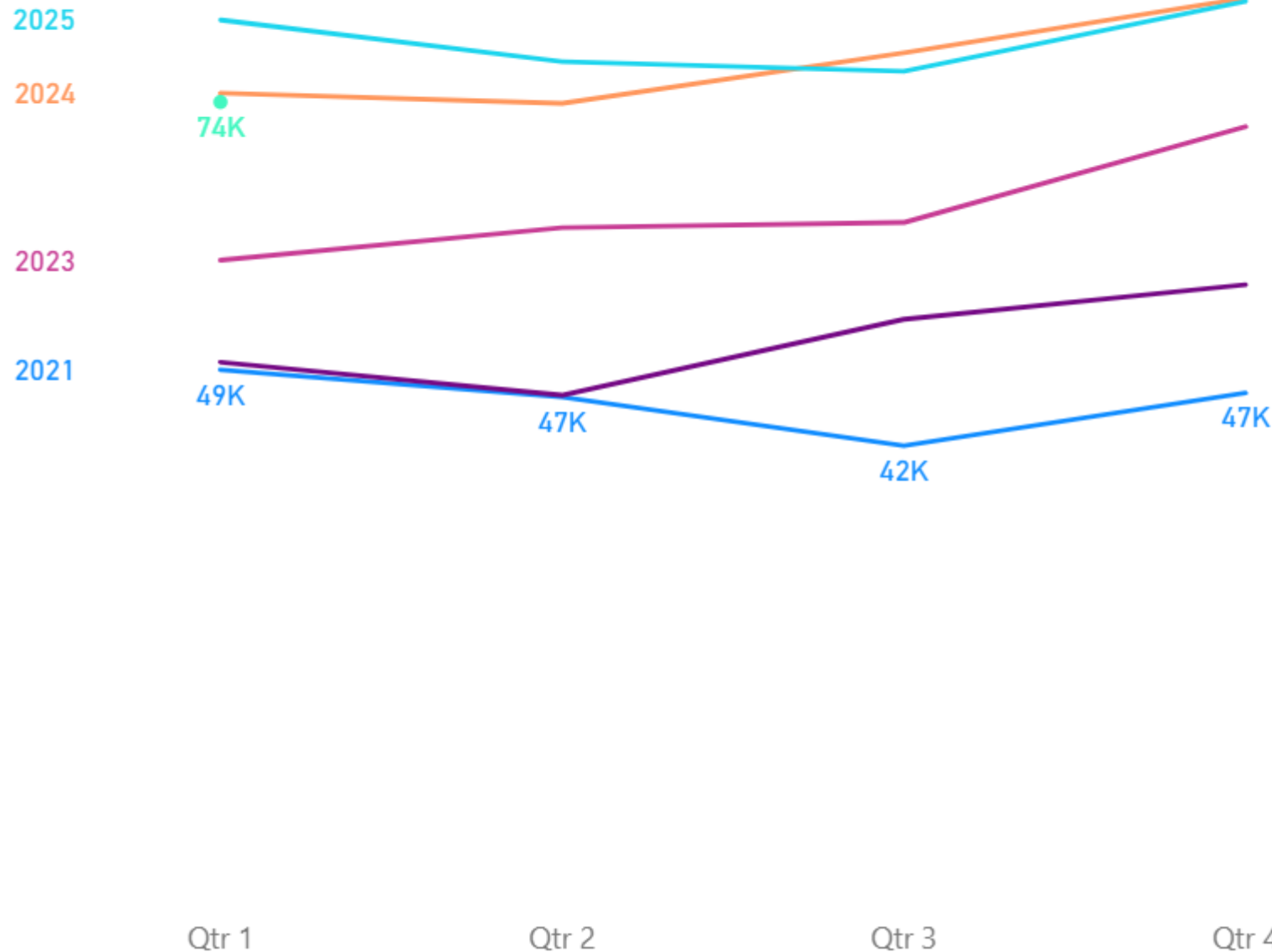
- ▼ 4% compared to 2025

Regular MFPs:

- ▼ 45% compared to 2025
- ▼ 55% compared to 2021

This graph also shows individual requests for food across our Big Three programs, comparing quarters across the years for the sum of those three programs.

Requests for food across these three programs continue to be greatly elevated compared to 2021-2022. Q1 2026 is in line with the elevated numbers we saw in Q1 of 2024 and 2025.
